\$750 Merle Langley Memorial Scholarship
Civil Engineering Transfer Program
Lane Community College

The purpose of the scholarship is to recognize and financially assist Lane Community College students who are interested in pursuing a **career in civil engineering or in the field of Public Works**.

Eligibility

Full-time students who are enrolled in the Civil Engineering Transfer program, that have completed 45 credits at the beginning of the academic year of the award will be considered for the scholarship. Course work must be taken at Lane Community College. Women and minority students are encouraged to apply.

Selection Criteria

1. Must have completed the first three quarters of the Civil Engineering Transfer program at the beginning of the academic year of the award with a grade point average of 3.0 or better.
2. Demonstrated financial need for the scholarship.
3. United States citizen or legal U.S. resident.
4. Two-year resident of the state of Oregon.

Procedure

1. **Applicant shall complete and deliver the following application materials to Angela Martinek, Coordinator for this scholarship, by May 2, 2018:**
 - a. Biographical Data Form provided by APWA
 - b. Copy of transcripts
 - c. Itemized statement of estimated income and expenses for the coming academic year
 - d. Listing of applicable employment experience, student activities, and community service
 - e. Statement of long-term education and career goals

2. **Lane Community College faculty shall review the applications and recommend one scholarship award recipient to the APWA Scholarship Committee for consideration. The recommendation, along with the requested application materials, must be submitted by May 14, 2018, to:**

Recommendation and application materials may be submitted in hard copy, fax, or email.

3. The APWA Scholarship Committee will review the recommendation and application materials for eligibility and completeness, then submit to the APWA Oregon Chapter Scholarship Foundation for consideration of award.
4. Scholarship faculty coordinators and award recipients will be notified by August 7, 2018.

Other information

A total of \$750 will be made available to the selected scholarship recipient. Half of the award will be disbursed at the beginning of the Fall Term and the other half at the beginning of Winter Term.

The scholarship recipient will be invited to attend either the Fall or Spring Conference to not only be recognized for their achievements but to also network with engineers and public works staff from both the public and private sectors. The Oregon Chapter APWA Fall Conference will be held in Canyonville, Oregon October 15-18, 2018 and the Spring 2019 conference will be held in Bend, Oregon. Free registration, conference meals and lodging accommodations will be provided for scholarship recipients by the Chapter. Students are responsible for their own transportation to and from the conference.
