

\$750 Les Lyle Memorial Scholarship Civil Engineering Technology Program Walla Walla Community College

Introduction

The purpose of the scholarship is to recognize and financially assist Oregon residents attending Walla Walla Community College who are interested in pursuing a **career in civil engineering or in the field of Public Works**.

Eligibility

Full-time students who are enrolled in the Civil Engineering Technology program, that have completed 45 credits at the beginning of the academic year of the award will be considered for the scholarship. Course work must be taken at Walla Walla Community College. Women and minority students are encouraged to apply.

Selection Criteria

1. Must have completed the first three quarters of the Civil Engineering Technology program at the beginning of the academic year of the award with a grade point average of 3.0 or better.
2. Demonstrated financial need for the scholarship.
3. United States citizen or U.S. legal resident.
4. Two-year resident of the state of Oregon.

Procedure

1. **Applicant shall complete and deliver the following application materials to:**

- b. Supplemental Information Form
- c. Copy of transcript

2. Walla Walla Community College faculty will review the applications and recommend one scholarship applicant to the APWA Scholarship Committee for consideration. The recommendation, along with the requested application materials, should be submitted, via email, to:

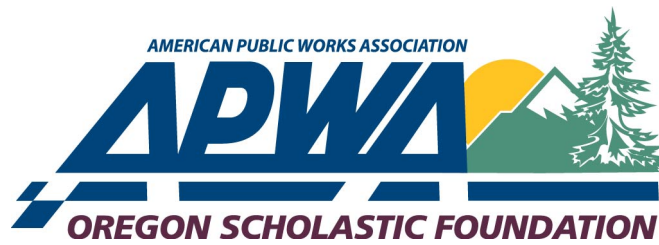

A total of \$750 will be made available to the selected scholarship recipient. Half of the award will be disbursed at the beginning of the Fall Term and the other half at the beginning of Winter Term. **Please note, should the award recipient change their address at any time during the school year, the scholarship committee chair needs to be notified ASAP to avoid any delay in the student receiving their scholarship funds.**

The scholarship recipient will be invited to attend either the fall or spring Chapter Conference to not only be recognized for their achievements but to also network with engineers and public works professionals from both the public and private sectors. The fall conference is generally held in mid- to late October and the spring conference is generally held in early to mid-April. Registration fees will be covered for scholarship recipients by the Chapter and once in-person conferences resume, meals and lodging will also be included. It should be noted that lodging will be limited to one room for women and another room for men with a two-person per room maximum. Students are responsible for their own transportation to and from the conference, however, ride share opportunities may be available with other conference attendees.

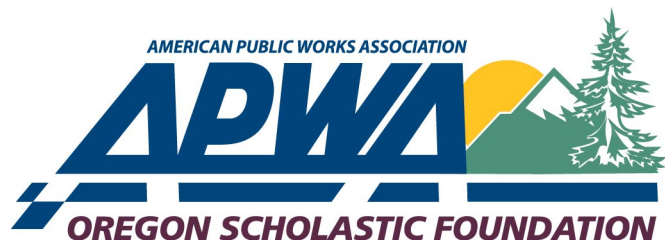

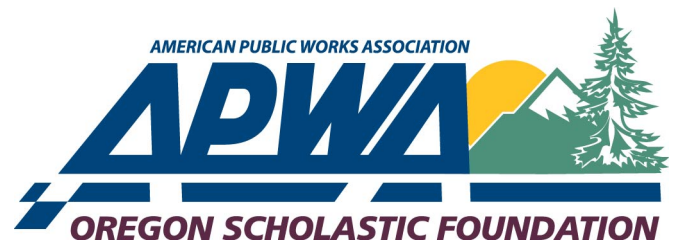
