

\$1,000 Kurt Corey Tribute Scholarship Oregon State University

Introduction

Kurt served as the Public Works Director at the City of Eugene for 16 years and was known nationally for his work with the American Public Works Association (APWA). Kurt was an active member of APWA, which in 2006 named him one of its top 10 leaders in the nation. The following year, he served as president of the state's chapter of the association and in 2010, he received the chapter's highest honor, the Bowes Award. He was passionate about excellent service delivery, and in 2004 he championed APWA's accreditation of Eugene Public Works, one of the first public agencies in the nation to earn this recognition. He was a great leader and friend who exemplified the public works profession through his dedication to the community and a deep sense of caring for his employees. Simply put, Kurt made a difference - to his community, his colleagues, and his friends. This scholarship recognizes Kurt's support of students with career goals in the broad field of Public Works.

Eligibility

Full-time civil engineering students who have achieved junior standing at the beginning of the academic year of the award will be considered for the scholarship. Students who receive the award during their junior year will again be eligible to apply for the award during their senior year, assuming they maintain eligibility for the scholarship. Course work must be taken at the school where the scholarship is awarded. Women and minorities are encouraged to apply.

Selection Criteria

1. Demonstrated financial need for the scholarship
2. Student enrolled in civil engineering or construction engineering management working toward a Bachelor of Science degree with demonstrated academic achievement and an interest in Public Works as a career.
3. Junior or senior standing at the beginning of the academic year of the award.
4. United States citizen or legal U.S. resident.
5. Four-year resident of the state of Oregon preferred but qualified applicants considered.

Procedure

1. **Applicant shall complete and deliver the following application materials to:**

- b. Supplemental Information Form
- c. Copy of transcript

2. Oregon State University faculty will review the applications and recommend one scholarship applicant to the APWA Scholarship Committee for consideration. The recommendation, along with the requested application materials, should be submitted, via email, to:

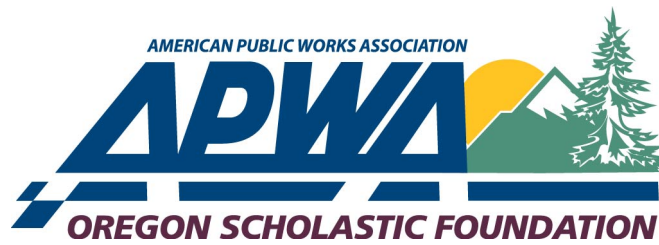

Other information

A total of \$1,000 will be made available to the selected scholarship recipient. Half of the award will be disbursed at the beginning of the Fall Term and the other half at the beginning of Winter Term. **Please note, should the award recipient change their address at any time during the school year, the scholarship committee chair needs to be notified ASAP to avoid any delay in the student receiving their scholarship funds.**

The scholarship recipient will be invited to attend either the fall or spring Chapter Conference to not only be recognized for their achievements but to also network with engineers and public works professionals from both the public and private sectors. The fall conference is generally held in mid- to late October and the spring conference is generally held in early to mid-April. Registration fees will be covered for scholarship recipients by the Chapter and once in-person conferences resume, meals and lodging will also be included. It should be noted that lodging will be limited to one room for women and another room for men with a two-person per room maximum. Students are responsible for their own transportation to and from the conference, however, ride share opportunities may be available with other conference attendees.

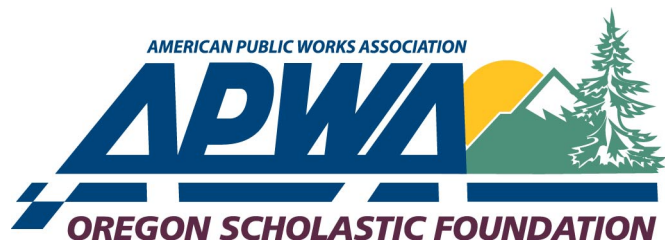

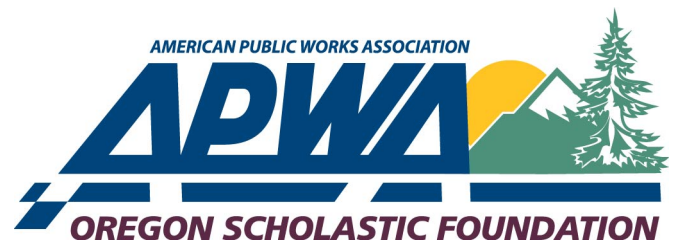
