

\$2,500 APAOEF/APWA Civil Engineering Scholarship University of Portland

Introduction

The Asphalt Pavement Association of Oregon Education Foundation, Inc. (“APAOEF”), and the APWA Oregon Chapter Scholastic Foundation (“APWA”), believe that although transportation infrastructure is often overlooked, it is vitally important to our economy and way of life. Through the scholarship referenced above we want to support students who recognize the importance of transportation infrastructure and spread the word to other civil engineering students.

Eligibility

Full-time civil engineering students who have achieved junior standing at the beginning of the academic year of the award will be considered for the scholarship. Students who receive the award during their junior year will again be eligible to apply for the award during their senior year, assuming they maintain eligibility for the scholarship. Course work must be taken at the school where the scholarship is awarded. Women and minorities are encouraged to apply.

Selection Criteria

1. Demonstrated financial need for the scholarship
2. Student enrolled in civil engineering or construction management working toward a Bachelor of Science degree
3. Junior or senior standing at the beginning of the academic year of the award.
4. Expressed interest in transportation infrastructure.
5. United States citizen or legal U.S. resident.
6. Four-year resident of the state of Oregon

Procedure

1. **Applicant shall complete and deliver the following application materials to:**

- c. Copy of transcript

2. University of Portland faculty will review the applications and recommend one scholarship applicant to the APWA Scholarship Committee for consideration. The recommendation, along with the requested application materials, should be submitted, via email, to:

Other information

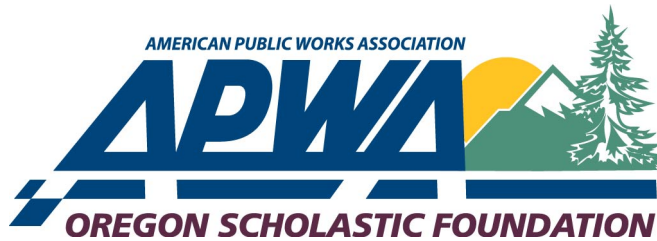
A total of \$2,500 will be made available to the selected scholarship recipient. Half of the award will be disbursed at the beginning of the Fall Term and the other half at the beginning of Winter Term. **Please note, should the award recipient change their address at any time during the school year, the scholarship committee chair needs to be notified ASAP to avoid any delay in the student receiving their scholarship funds.**

The scholarship recipient will be invited to attend the Asphalt Pavement Association of Oregon's Annual Meeting, to be recognized for his or her achievements and to network with civil engineering and construction industry professionals. Details pertaining to the Asphalt Pavement Association of Oregon's Annual Meeting will be provided as they become available.

The scholarship recipient will also be invited to attend either the fall or spring Chapter Conference to not only be recognized for their achievements but to also network with engineers and public works professionals from both the public and private sectors. The fall conference is generally held in mid- to late October and the spring conference is generally held in early to mid-April. Registration fees will be covered for scholarship recipients by the Chapter and once in-person conferences resume, meals and lodging will also be included. It should be noted that lodging will be limited to one room for women and another room for men with a two-person per room maximum. Students are responsible for their own transportation to and from the conference, however, ride share opportunities may be available with other conference attendees.

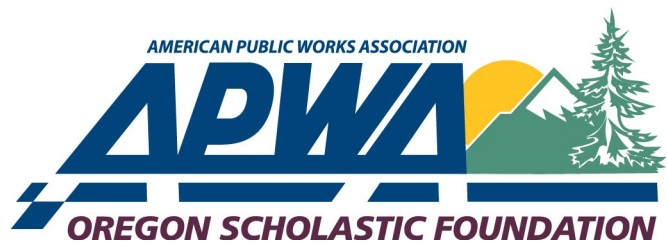

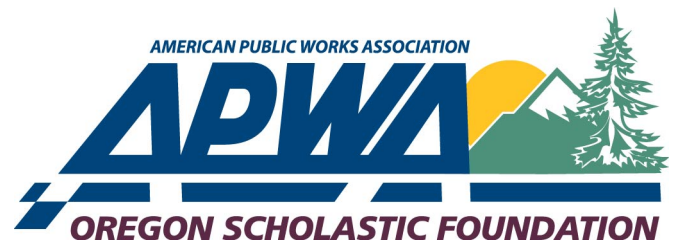
