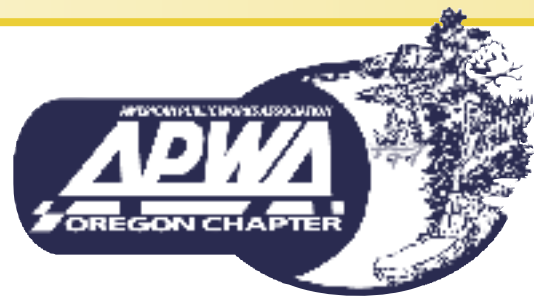

OREGON CHAPTER SUBMITS ENTRIES FOR NATIONAL AWARDS

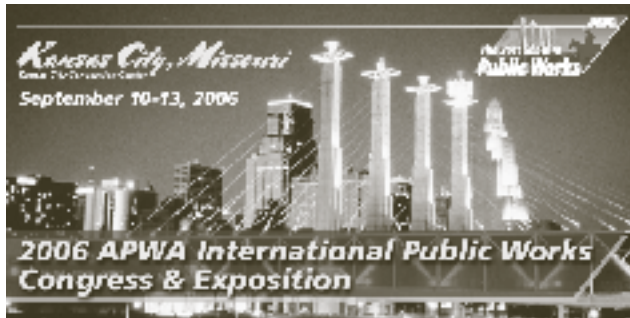
The Oregon Chapter of APWA has submitted several nominations for 2006 awards by National APWA. The award submittals include:

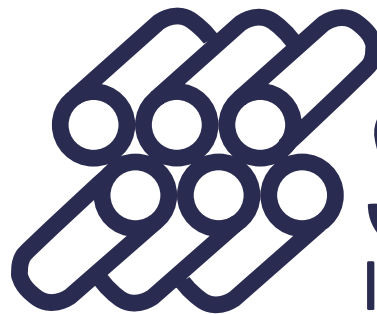

JACK PITTIS MEMORIAL FUND

Jack Pittis, a member of the APWA Board of Directors, died unexpectedly of heart complications at his home on February 3. He had been recovering from injuries resulting from a two-vehicle collision that occurred on January 31 in Kitsap County, Washington. He was 59.

Pittis graduated from Washington State University in 1969 with a degree in civil engineering. He became a Professional Engineer in 1974, a City Engineer in 1976, and Director of Public Works, City of Port Angeles, Washington in 1980, retiring in 2000. He had been involved in APWA activities for nearly 30 years and went through the chairs of the Washington State Chapter, becoming president in 1990. In 1993 he was named a Top Ten Public Works Leader of the Year. He was truly committed to education and training at all levels of public works.
